

- The closing date for paper proposals has now passed. Over 200 outstanding papers will be presented at this first ever exploration of law's empire co-hosted by Antipodean and Canadian scholarly organizations. Delegates wishing to attend the conference need to take the following steps, even if papers have been accepted for presentation:

### 1) ACCOMMODATION
